

# FY24 Funding Utilization & Current Base Budget Overview

• The AFB was allocated \$22,500 in FY24 to support RSOs.

• Only \$2,000 was awarded to student programs in FY24, which restricted the number of RSOs that could be funded.

• 100% of Funds are ONLY for RSOs

We did receive one-time FY25 funds for student leader wages.

Currently, AFB is using the money we received to sponsor student organizations and the events they host.

AFB funding enables RSO to increase membership, organize successful events, and provides Financial security to fund programs in the future.

The AFB has already prioritized funding for already planned events, such as Homecoming and Halloween fest.

The AFB has been relying on funding from the Office of Student Involvement and Leadership (OSIL) for administrative work, which is not sustainable in the long term.


## FY26 One-Time Funding Request

Amount: \$63,900.50

In the bylaws that were developed for the Activities Funding Board in line with the University of Houston it states that we request 1% of funds

• \$26,858 in addition to base budget of \$22,500 for RSO Funding

• \$13,042.50 for student leader wages



• \$1,500 for Maintenance and operating fees

## **Budget Reduction Accommodation**

Funding Reduction: A 5% budget reduction would result in a decrease of \$1,100 in total funding available for RSOs.

Impact on RSOs: This significant decrease could limit RSOs' ability to organize events, purchase supplies, or travel for conferences.

- Direct or Reimbursement
- On-Campus Activities
- Marketing must include AFB brand
- Open to all UHCL student body

#### **Selection Process**

- Decision of the Chair
- Must Maintain Fair & Mindset
- Former Member MUST Reapply Each Year

### **General Operations**

- Application Submissions
- Hearings Following Application
- RSO Presentation at Hearings
- Hearing Deliberation

### **Appealing Process**

- RSOs can request appeals through SFAC.
- SFAC has the ultimate decision.
