





#### FY23-24 SWEPT FUNDS

Student Government returned \$8,251.00 in funding for FY24. Funding was left over from the professional development trip to the NACA Student Government Institute. One SG officer was not able to attend the trip due to recovery from Hurricane Beryl, so those funds were not spent. Additionally, EC vacancies contributed to unspent funds. Initiatives, trainings and events typically funded by SG and supported by EC officers, Senators, Directors and Committee Reps could not be facilitated, which led to a decline in spending on events (i.e. Halloween Fest Bubble Soccer, Awareness Days, SG Day Activities, Elections, etc.). Also, the EC vacancies over the course of the year led to savings in wages. EC was not fully staffed until February 2024.

# FY25-26 FUND REQUESTS

### FY25-26 FUND REQUESTS

EC salary/wages	\$12,000	\$12,000 (\$18,300 wages - \$6,300 base funding = \$12,000 to be requested)
Professional Development	\$10,000	\$2,500 lodging/airfare/meals x 4 EC members = \$10,000
SG Signature Events	\$4,000	\$2,000 Fall/\$2000 Spring to support general assembly meeting food, Domestic Violence Awareness event, Weeks of Welcome student activity, Chili cook-off, Halloween Fest, President's Luncheon, SG Day, SG transition meeting, retreats, Senate/Committee Rep trainings, meetings, Senate Tabling refreshments, etc.
Promotional Items	\$4,000	These items will help with brand recognition and help students become more aware of our outreach and advocacy on campus.
EC Parking Passes	\$420	\$105 Parking permit x 4 EC officers
Senator Parking Passes	\$840	Senators are not paid but have expectations and conduct outreach. Parking passes would be a great incentive for Senators, since they are not compensated.

# BUDGET REDUCTION

SG has \$2,000 in base funding.

A 5% reduction is \$100.

SG would limit purchases food and office supplies.
